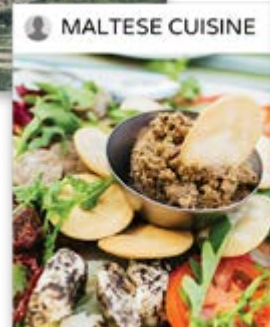
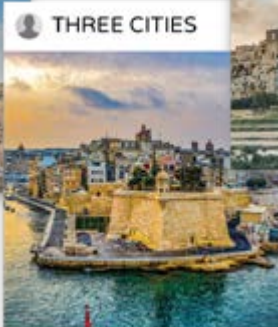
Sliema's promenade is one of the most popular social meeting places in Malta.
